


100 YEARS YOUNG CONGRATULATIONS, ANDREW FOGARTY!

To honour the Prime Minister and all those present, we invited the 438 Tactical Helicopter Squadron Brass Quintet and their singer, Sergeant Marc Adolph to lead us in the Canadian National Anthem. I glanced over at the Prime Minister and I could see that it brought a tear to his eye. As I looked about the ballroom, I had the overwhelming impression of a sense of pride in being Canadian.

Mr. Ken Quinn, Vice President of St. Patrick's Society presented Ms. Lori Morrison with the 2019 St. Patrick's Society of Montreal Community Award.

Our raffle this year helped our fundraising by bringing in over \$6,000.00. The two tickets to Ireland were won by Miss Maureen McCormick. They were presented to her by Ms. June Tiffney, Regional Sales Manager in Canada for Aer Lingus. I tried to persuade Maureen that we were related and would be happy to accompany her to Ireland but there was no way of convincing her of that.



Mr. Mulroney was introduced by his longtime friend and colleague, The Honorable Jean Charest, who was our guest speaker last year. At the end of his speech, Mr. Charest signaled us to play a recording of Mr. Mulroney singing, "When Irish Eyes are Smiling". I had the privilege of receiving one copy of his CD that he recorded for his children and grandchildren. I have to say Frank Sinatra was lucky

that Mr. Mulroney went into politics rather than showbiz! Mr. Mulroney then spoke to the audience. He did not



disappoint us. In a way only he can deliver, with eloquence, fervor and conviction, Mr. Mulroney enlightened us about what he believes it means to be Canadian. As he was going to celebrate his 80th birthday a few days later, we surprised him with a 3-tier birthday cake and the uniformed 438 Tactical Squadron and Sergeant Marc Adolph led us in a rousing rendition of "Happy Birthday". Once

again, Mr. Mulroney was touched and showed his appreciation for our gesture. But that was not all! Our President, Christie Brown presented him with his own shillelagh (walking stick) as a birthday gift from St. Patrick's Society. We were thrilled with the positive reviews as people expressed their appreciation of the day – even though it was slightly longer than usual.


For 186 years, St. Patrick's Society of Montreal has either played a pivotal role in organizing Montreal's iconic St. Patrick's Parade or has been a participant. On March 17th, the Parade returned to a more familiar but shortened route for its 196th edition: Saint Catherine Street from Fort to Mansfield.

Spectators of all ages and communities lined the route to celebrate the Irish community and to welcome spring to Montreal. They certainly were not disappointed with the many bands, colourful floats, clowns and mascots to entertain them.

St. Patrick's Society, again a parade sponsor, participated with a strong contingent and was visible throughout the parade with signage at the reviewing stand and on banners in the parade. Our unit was preceded by the Montreal Pipes & Drums. Led by president Christie Brown, the group was a family-friendly unit of members, old and new.

Director Paul Loftus proudly walked down the street in his second and final parade as United Irish Societies president. JAMES CONNOLLY VISITOR'S CENTRE

On Friday, April 19th, one hundred American and Canadian trade unionists marched up the Falls Road in Belfast to mark the official opening of the James Connolly Visitor's Centre. Connolly, one the signers of the 1916 Proclamation, was executed by the British for his role in the Easter Rising.

President of Ireland Michael D. Higgins delivered the keynote speech for the official launch of the new centre ARAS UI Chonshale. Higgins described the importance of Connolly in his own time as someone who brought together the ideas of nationalism, internationalism, trade unionism, gender equality, and social justice as well as noting the relevance of his thinking for Ireland today.

Among other speakers were British Trades Union Congress (TUC) general secretary Frances O'Grady and Irish Congress of Trade Unions (ICTU) assistant general secretary Owen Reidy, as well as the MP for West Belfast, Paul Maskey.

An especially interesting aspect of the Centre is that funding from the Belfast City Council was a joint initiative between Sinn Féin and the Democratic Unionist Party (DUP). The Centre will be both a major tourist attraction in Manager of the James Connolly Visitor Belfast and a resource for unions in Ireland and the UK.

Ciné Gael Montréal closed its twenty-seventh season on Friday May 3, 2019 with the hard-hitting prison drama, Michael Inside. Dafhyd Flynn's seemingly, effortless intensity emphasized by the stark body language was matched pitch perfect to Frank Berry's tight direction and up-close camera work. As a bonus our audience members were treated to a short, friendly introduction recorded by the director with Dafhyd by his side. Since this movie was the closing film, everyone was invited afterwards to a reception for a glass of wine and wonderful food . These receptions are always terrific opportunities to meet other members and share thoughts on the films presented.

As we look back at the twenty-seventh season, several highlights stand out.

We were ecstatic to land Black '47, the truly explosive story set in the time of the infamous Great Irish Famine. This film set the tone for the season and raised the bar for expectations.

Sean Mannion who emigrated to America and became a protegé of the Irish mob Boston. Before the film, Montreal Canadien legend, Chris Nilan, graciously agreed to speak introducing both Sean t h e a n d neighbourhood that Sean called home for many years.

After the film, the audience was treated to a Q&A session via Skype with one of the producers, Ronan Mac Con Iomaire who is always an entertaining speaker even when it's 2 a.m. in Dublin.

In March we presented the extraordinary documentary film, Shelter Me: Apollo House



that dealt with the homeless crisis in Dublin. An added bonus that evening was the Skype conversation after the film with the actor and writer, Terry McMahon, who was one of the participants in the occupation of Apollo House.

Also in March Lomax in Éirinn was presented. The brilliant introduction by Ciné Gael Montreal's very own, Antoine Maloney, set up the movie perfectly allowing audience members to situate how and why Alan Lomax was such an influential figure in music preservation.

One of Ciné Gael Montreal's annual highlights is the evening of short films. This year was no exception and the audience was left struggling to determine the best of an incredible slate of short films. When the final votes were counted, the clear winner was Bonnie Dempsey's film All in Good Time, a touching film about two young people living in very different times.







THE SCHOOL OF IRISH STUDIES TO HOST MAJOR IRISH STUDIES CONFERENCE

Irish Studies began in 1991 and evolved into a separate academic department at Concordia University in 2009. To mark the 10th anniversary of the School of Irish Studies, a series of special events is being held in 2019.



Irish Studies (CAIS) will be held at Concordia this year, organized by Professor Jane McGaughey, Associate Professor of Irish Studies. She is also President of CAIS.



The conference will welcome about a hundred delegates from Canada and around the world, and will schedule academic lectures and panel discussions on a wide range of topics, as well as keynote lectures by Professor Joanna Burke (Birbeck, University of London) and Professor Rhona Richman Kenneally (Concordia University). Other events will include: the premiere of a major film on the tragic story of an Irish immigrant ship to Quebec; a reading and Master Class in creative writing by the high-profile Irish writer Kevin Barry; the launch of the most recent edition of Winter Papers, the exciting Irish cultural journal edited by Kevin Barry and Olivia Smith; the launch of a special issue of the Canadian Journal of Irish Studies on the contemporary Irish Short Story edited by Michael Kenneally; and, in conjunction with Montreal Jewish Public Library a special exhibition, Representations of the Jews in Irish Literature, with an opening lecture titled "Hyphenated Identity: Irish-Jewish Autobiographies," by Professor Pól Ó Dochartaigh, National University of Ireland Galway. 


PEOPLE IN THE NEWS
